Brief Description of Service:	As mandated by the Animal Welfare Act (AWA) and Regulations (Title 9 C.R.R., Sect. 2.33), the Campus Veterinarian (CV) provides veterinary care to all animals used for research and teaching at the University of California, Riverside (UCR). Such care includes training, preventive medicine, clinical, and diagnostic services. Animal species used for research and teaching at UCR include laboratory mice and rats, deer mice, California mice, cats, bats, chickens, hummingbirds, frogs, turtles, lizards, and fish. Weekend, holiday, and emergency care is readily available by the CV as adequate veterinary care must be provided at all times according to the federal regulations (Sect. 2.33(b)). The CV is responsible for routine animal care services, which include animal procurement, housing, provision of diets and water, daily observation of animals, reporting of abnormal conditions to the veterinary staff, carcass disposal, sanitization of rooms, cages, racks, and other equipment. The CV is a voting member of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) as required by the regulations (Sect. 2.33(a)(3)).
